




## **DEVOTEE SPEAKS**

Speak as low as possible, as little as possible, as sweetly as possible. One of the first principles of straight living is to practice silence. For the voice of God can be heard in the region of your heart only when the tongue is stilled and the storm is stilled and the waves are calm. There will be no temptation for others to shout when you talk to them in whispers. Set the level of the tone yourself—as low as possible, as high as necessary to reach the outermost boundary of the circle you are addressing. You feel the presence of God when silence reigns.

within himself and examine his own faults


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#### **Service Wing Updates:**
